# Across the Great Divide



Join us on Friday 11th March for another great night of music. Our guests will be Across the Great Divide with Karen Jones on clarsach (harp), guitar and vocals. Tony Burt on dobro, guitar and percussion and special guest Paul Turner on bagpipes,

whistles, percussion and vocals.

The Celtic music of Karen Jones and the Americana styles of Tony Burt do indeed hail from across the Great Divide. They have perfectly united these 2 genres to create a musical landscape that is in itself unique. Tony, with his original compositions and sensitive, dynamic dobro playing, blend beautifully with the haunting and deeply moving traditional sounds of Karen's Celtic harp. They are joined by Paul Turner, another fine musician and multi-instrumentalist who is again steeped in Celtic lore. These multi instrumentalists combine 2 major folk genres of NZ in a celebration of traditional and contemporary songs, beautiful airs, foot stomping tunes and seriously good musicianship.

Before our guests performs there will be a **blackboard concert** (7.30-8.45pm) followed by supper. Doors open at 7.00pm for blackboard booking. This is going

to be a wonderful and unique concert not to be missed.



Atrix has been playing at the Medieval Market, for nearly twenty years, initially with two of the main folk club founders, Eddie and Evie Lambert. Over the years the band has included Tim Cooper (dec), Bruce Welby (dec), Maria and Graham McDonald, Bob Cheeseman, Andrew Salter and were once joined by Colleen Trenwith on fiddle. Songs are drawn from days of old, featuring knights, maidens,

wenches, and kings and queens. Instruments, such as whistles, drums, bouzouki, mandolin, violin, guitars, ukulele and accordion give a medieval sound. This year Atrix performed over 54 songs and tunes over three hours. (Thanks Rona)

#### WOMAD in March (Dale's comments)



Excitement is building with WOMAD's excellent music festival scheduled for March 18-20 in Pukekura Park, New Plymouth. A wonderful program of world music, including NZ star bands, is planned from Friday 6pm to late Sunday, with all food and drink available on site. Music on Saturday and Sunday starts at noon, leaving time for leisurely breakfast, coffee or walk around

town. Buy your tickets online now and try camping. This has worked really well for me in past years as it ensures you are a short walk from the venue and don't miss a thing. It costs \$59 pp and you and your vehicle are parked inside the track with facilities available in the racecourse buildings (and some horses working the track in the early morning for atmosphere). No loud parties either, as everyone is exhausted each night by 12 hrs of walking between stages in the beautiful but hilly venue. I've attended 12 or so WOMADs – each one has exceeded my expectations and this year guests include Ladysmith Black Mambazo, John Grant, ethio-soul Queen Ester Rada, alt-country rockers Calexico, DakhaBrakha, Seun Kuti & Egypt 80 from Nigeria with Bic Runga, Tiny Ruins, Julia Deans, Katchafire and Pass The Gat (Warren Maxwell, Louis Baker, Thomas Oliver) and Tami Neilson.
