WAI.TAI - UP CLOSE AND PERSONAL TOUR



Our guest artists for October concert night are WAI.TAI. We will be treated to the harmonies and rhythms of traditional Maori songs and chants, fused with world music including Celtic, Polish, Middle Eastern, Jamaican and more. Songs are embodied by the call of the feminine voices, earthy percussion and delicate strings. A carefully crafted soundscape. "Emotive, subtle and heartening". WAI.TAI is where song lines from the southern-most ocean currents converge with world music. The oceans unite all peoples, and the music honours our connections. Traditional Maori songs and chants are fused with international music to create the wairua-imbued sounds of WAI.TAI. Read more about WAI.TAI on the next page. WAI.TAI Bios

Robyn Kamira

Musical director of WAI.TAI, Robyn Kamira writes and arranges the music, and selects the line up from a "cast" of musicians, based on their vocal and instrumental affinity with the music and for the occasion. Robyn was taught by Hirini Melbourne, a well-respected Maori academic and musician who was instrumental in restoring the knowledge relating to taonga puoro (traditional Maori instruments). She seeks to contribute to his aspiration to share traditional knowledge through music. Her Te Rarawa tribal links are a characteristic of the dialect and content of her music, and she fuses this with a range of World music styles.

Krissy Jackson

Since she could walk, Krissy Jackson has been playing the fiddle. Her mantra of "have fiddle - will travel" has landed her in many a musical situation, playing a variety of styles with many people. Performing regularly with Hot Diggity and the Frank Burkitt Band, Krissy is well known for her bluegrass style. However, Krissy's WAI.TAI contribution will be an almost ethereal style that weaves its way insightfully through the set. Krissy enjoys acknowledging her Ihutai, Te Rarawa tribal connections through music and fuses this with her Celtic background and more recently has played fusion Indian music with Sargum Fusion.

Luther Hunt

Young Wellington based drummer-percussionist Luther Hunt is part of a thriving music scene in Wellington. He has played many gigs and festivals around the country including Auckland, Wellington and Taranaki Arts Festivals, WOMAD, Soundsplash, RnV, Wild Foods Festival, Parihaka and Wellington Jazz Festival. Luther has been studying Jazz Performance at the New Zealand School of Music for five years, and is in his last trimester of an honors year. He is influenced by a multitude of styles and genres and is an essential part of the WAI.TAI line up for WellyFest this year, bringing an inspired percussive element to the set.

Meet a Member- Kate Lang



Kate grew up in Wellington in an environment where playing music was not encouraged. While she was not allowed to own a guitar, she loved music. As a teenager she knew all the bands and learned all the songs on the

hit parade. Her interest in folk music was sparked in the 1970s when she moved to Auckland and first heard Steeleye Span. She thought their music both weird and wonderful and was captivated by the story telling and magic of the songs. This love of ballads and traditional folk songs has stayed with Kate and still influences what she enjoys singing.

In 2008 she moved to Otaki and not knowing anyone, auditioned for a role in Jesus Christ Superstar. She won a place in the chorus and describes it as an awesome experience. She went on to perform in other musicals

including ANZAC, Blood Brothers and The 70's Show. In 2011 she shifted to Levin. Again, not knowing anyone, she came along to the Folk Club where she got a big hug from our Ivan, (who was a complete stranger at the time). A case of mistaken identity Ivan reckons. Kate came along to a number of Acoustic Nights and after much encouragement sang solo for the first time. Since then we have all enjoyed her performances as a member of Friends and more recently with Jo Sheffield as a duet. She often sings unaccompanied where her love of timeless ballads, some centuries old, shines through. She inherited a good memory from her dad and reckons learning the words is critical to connecting the audience with the story and heart of the song. Her music heroes include Steeleye Span, Gordon Lightfoot, Cat Stevens and John Denver. A future challenge is to sing with a backing band and a future ambition is to learn to play and sing with the guitar she never had as a kid. She has one now and we look forward to many more performances of the music she loves and hearing that guitar. (Ed)

Picks & Tips for the Month

Chris's Pick

OnSong: For anyone using Onsong, they have created a console for use on any computer as well as a new app for Mac. This enables editing as well as adding songs from your computer. You can also type songs in directly.

OnSong Console is a powerful add-on that lets you edit your library on any computer using a standard, modern web browser. You get a real-time preview of your chord chart along with palettes that help you make your chord charts just right. When you're all done, one click saves the chord chart back to your library. Most people agree that laptops or desktops are great at creating content. OnSong Console lets you use your computer to quickly make changes to your OnSong library. What's more, you can even make changes to an iPad while it's being used on the stage, or use it in the back-of-house to determine lyrics for a song. (Thanks Chris. ED)

Born in London to a Yorkshire mother and a Nigerian father, Paul Ubana Jones was playing guitar by the age of 11. This was the beginning of a three-decade career that would see him crossing continents and recording eight albums. He continues to perform regularly in New Zealand, Australia, and internationally. Over the years, Paul has shared the stage with various artists, including Taj Mahal, Keb Mo, Norah Jones, Bob Dylan, Tuck and Patti, Crowded House and many others.
