## **Concert Night with Reverie**





Tony and Victoria draw their sound from the head, heart and soul of the folk roots movement. Victoria has built an enviable reputation as a talented young singer/songwriter and vocal accompanist. There is a spell binding quality to her voice that she weaves into every performance and any genre. With a special passion for harmony, her accompaniment on guitar, dulcimer or bodhran is always relaxed and thoughtful. Tony is recognised for performances that are liberally laced with strong, emotional melodies and lyrics. Tony has long been associated with folk clubs and festivals and performs traditional and contemporary songs from New Zealand, America and the British Isles. He has been described as having "a voice like hot creamy chocolate!" Tony's fingerstyle accompaniment on guitar and six string banjo adds beautiful layers of melody as if another voice were in the mix.

Recently Reverie put down 11 of their favourite traditional and contemporary tracks, all in one live, intimate and unaffected recording session. The duo's debut album **BLOOD MEMORIES** will be available in August 2017, on a special edition USB with lots of free stuff packed in; film of the recording session, lyrics and lots of extras. #### **Gladstone Road**



The group takes its name from one of the earliest roads in the history of the Horowhenua. The group members' musical interests have

followed many roads: Celtic, country, blues, traditional, instrumentals, bluegrass, alt country, and New Zealand songs. Expect a variety of folk, country, bluegrass and beyond.

Gladstone Road has been forged in the music environment of Levin Folk Music Club - the place where their musical skills have been developed to the stage of polished music performances. A passion for music brings a variety of styles and multiple instrument use. All of the band members have been participants for very many years at the Levin Folk Music Club and have held active roles in the past as chairman or committee members. As well as being a musician, Han Roeters is a skilled restorer of damaged violins and has also completely built several violins himself.

#### **My Music**

#### lan Todd



Ian has been a long time member, supporter and intrepid worker for the Levin Folk Music Club over many years. This is Ian's music story. (Ed)

In 1974, I was about to leave Germany after five years to join my family in New Zealand. One of my farewells involved a night in the Bohemian part of Dusseldorf. In the

wee hours, we heard an acoustic guitar playing and went in to find an Irishman playing. I was instantly captivated. Until then I'd grown up in Liverpool and was a regular at the Cavern Club with rock bands a-plenty. I saw most of the big names in Europe along with trad jazz that I also came to love. As soon as I got to New Zealand, I grabbed my brother and we headed off to the Wellington Folk Club in Holland Street. Many of the club members are still part of the folk world today. Even though most of my family sang, I considered I was a non-singer until I was lucky enough to have lessons at Teachers College from the highly eccentric Maxwell Fernie. He taught us to breathe properly when singing and had us singing scales each week. I started singing trad at the folk club which was very popular at the time. Every Friday the club held Sing around sessions and practising each week helped. Every Sunday there was a concert. Folk music was on a massive high. The club had a tramping club off-shoot run by Ron Craig. Every month we went away for a weekend tramp and explored many parts of the Tararuas from both sides of the ranges. Ron was famous for saying 'Ten minutes' anytime anyone asked how far it was to the hut. I went onto the committee and became Secretary, and wrote the club newsletter which was typed, photocopied, folded and stuffed into labelled envelopes. Around 160 members so it took quite a while to get ready to post. In 1976 I was on the Wellington Folk Festival committee. At that time, the festival was on Queen's Birthday Weekend in Victoria University, with the final concert in the Opera House. Workshops featured heavily in those days. After the final concert there was a huge singing party at the clubrooms. There was a concrete stairwell leading up to the second floor. This was filled with singers and the acoustics were fantastic. There was much to enjoy at Wellington festivals but I prefer the current venue.

In 1980 I left Wellington and took a job at Levin Intermediate. I didn't find a folk club so went back to theatre for a couple of decades. I re-joined the folk world in 1999 when the Levin club was located above Leader and Watt. It was a neat venue but changes were afoot and the club moved to its current venue.I was asked to audition for Golowan as John Dekker was leaving. I passed and Charlie, Han and I had 12 years of playing at the club and gigging around the district. We sang whatever appealed so anything from trad Irish songs through to Pink Floyd and all points in between. Never a cross word in all that time but plenty of laughs. Golowan and Club members supported Little Theatre's fundraising St Patrick's Day concert for a decade. Our biggest gig was playing at the Wellington Festival's opening concert. I enjoyed my time with them very much but thought it was time for a change. I sang with Jo, Kate and Charlie for a while but then started shift work which made organising practices difficult. I enjoyed compering, playing and being on the first committee. I'm grateful and proud to have a good

number of friends from folk world. (Thanks Ian and best wishes from all club members. Ed)
