Crooked Weather are a UK folk duo touring New Zealand. From East-Yorkshire, Crooked Weather play rock infused folk music. The sound is led by carefully crafted lyrics delivered by the lilting harmonies of Holly Blackshaw and Will Bladen. Their songs echo the ethos of folk songsmiths before them, with imagery of escape, adventure, companionship and inner searching, but told from a different heart. Their original music, although steeped in the folk revival of the 60's and 70's, has a raw, modern edge.

In the last year Holly and Will have toured the lengths and breadths of Ireland, New Zealand, U.S., England and Holland, and have more recently been joined by Tom, Dan and Dave - a fierce rhythm section - in their full band.
